The Board met in session at the Linn County Jean Oxley Public Service Center. Present: Chairperson Meisheid, Vice Chairperson Running-Marquardt (via phone) and Supervisor Scheetz. Board members voting "AYE" unless otherwise noted.

Chairperson Meisheid called the meeting to order and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

The sum of \$1,055,910 is ordered to be transferred from the General Basic fund to the Secondary Roads fund, as allowed under the Code of Iowa maximum transfer limits.

WHEREAS, it is desired to transfer monies from the General Basic fund to the Conservation Reserve fund and,

Section 1. ESTABLISH ROAD CLOSURE AND DETOUR FOR MATSELL PARK ROAD BRIDGE REPLACEMENT
(SUPERSEDES RESOLUTION 2025-3-47)

WHEREAS: Linn County Project FM-C057(173)—55-57, bridge replacement project, on Matsell Park Road in Linn County will begin soon.

WHEREAS, the Linn County Board of Supervisors previously passed and approved Resolution 2025-3-47 establishing road closure and detour for Linn County Project FM-C057(173)—55-57.

WHEREAS, the Linn County Board of Supervisors desires to repeal and replace Resolution 2025-3-47 to revise the detour route.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors that Resolution 2025-3-47 is hereby repealed and replaced with this resolution.

WHEREAS: A map of the detour is attached hereto.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED: Commencing at the intersection of Matsell Park Road and County Home Road/Fairview Road head east 1.75 miles along Fairview Road to County Road X28, then continue north 2.0 miles on County Road X28 to Stone City Road, then continue northeasterly on Stoney City Road 1.0 mile to Ridge Road, continue northwesterly 1.7 miles on Ridge Road until the Linn County line where Ridge Road becomes Buffalo Ridge Road, then continue 1.3 miles northwesterly to Hart Road, then continue west on Hart Road 0.5 miles to the end of the detour at Matsell Park Road. (See attached map)

Signs shall be placed when and as necessary to protect the work and the traveling public in accordance with the Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices and Chapter 306 of the Code of Iowa.

Approve and authorize the Chair to sign agreements for Linn County Deputy Sheriff Pre-Employment Training for the following: Jonathan Holt, Jonathan Kastantin, Andrew Ossman, John Schwetfeger, Sage Utzinger, and Mason Ward.
