SUBJECT: Support for Tower Terrace Road Improvements – Linn County, Iowa
(2022 RAISE Grant Application)

Dear Secretary Buttigieg:

On behalf of the Linn County Board of Supervisors, I offer the Board's full support of the Tower Terrace Road Corridor Improvements project and the RAISE grant that Corridor MPO is applying for to help pay for this critical multi-jurisdictional project.

Tower Terrace Road is a significant multi-city, multi-modal transportation project that has been planned for over 20 years. This project will finally connect Interstate 380 on the west to Iowa Highway 13 on the east by completing the last missing links of the corridor. The Cities of Hiawatha, Robins, Cedar Rapids, and Marion, along with Linn County and the Corridor Metropolitan Planning Organization, have partnered and are working collectively to complete this important multi-modal transportation corridor. Corridor MPO's RAISE grant request of \$25 million will be applied to the remaining portions of the corridor, a project totaling over \$50 million.

While we support this project for many reasons, including the economic benefits to local businesses, its job creation possibilities, and the safer routes and reduced travel times for our citizens, it also will enhance the services Linn County LIFTS is able to provide. Linn County LIFTS is our public transit service providing door-to-door rides for eligible elderly and disabled citizens in the metro area of Cedar Rapids, Marion, and Hiawatha, in addition to public transportation to all Linn County residents outside the metro area. LIFTS is a paratransit service, with priority given to people who are unable to use city buses because of a disability or a disabling health condition; it assists some of the most vulnerable individuals in our communities in accessing the necessary services and goods to provide a high quality of life. As a public provider, LIFTS has a vested interest in providing these trips in the most cost-efficient manner it can. The improvements this project will provide will allow LIFTS to more efficiently serve those living in or traveling through that area.

The partnerships formed to complete this project represent a strong regional focus, and the many jurisdictions that will enjoy the results of the completion of this project are united in their support. I encourage you to support this application and assist Corridor MPO and its partners in continuing the momentum to finish this vital transportation improvement.

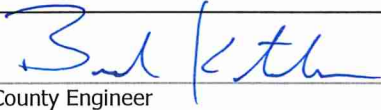

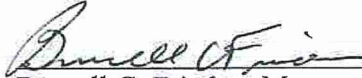

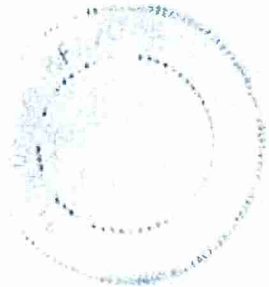

**ROAD MAINTENANCE AND SNOW & ICE CONTROL AGREEMENT
CITY OF FAIRFAX AND
LINN COUNTY SECONDARY ROAD DEPARTMENT**

WHEREAS, for the benefit of the traveling public and the mutual benefit of the City of Fairfax, Iowa and Linn County, Iowa, and

WHEREAS, to effectively deal with common street and road maintenance problems which occur on shared portions and are considered to be of a normal and routine nature, to enhance consistency of related traffic control measures and to provide a more cost effective maintenance program, and

WHEREAS, to effectively deal with the common problem of snow removal and ice control on road surfaces and to promote the safer flow of traffic;

NOW THEREFORE, the City of Fairfax, Iowa (City) and Linn County, Iowa (County) herewith enter into agreement for maintenance and upkeep of roads and for snow and ice control on those roads as listed and shown on attached Exhibits and under the provisions hereinafter stated.

MAINTENANCE

The City shall provide normal and routine maintenance on County portions of roads indicated. The County shall provide normal and routine maintenance on City portions of roads indicated. For the purpose of this agreement normal and routine maintenance shall include the following work items as needed:

- minor ditch cleaning
- granular surface grading
- shoulder repair (No additional rock required)
- minor surface repairs such as crack sealing or pothole repair
- debris removal, illegal dumping clean up and dead animal disposal
- mowing – any and all mowing along County secondary roads shall be in accordance with Iowa Code 314.17
- tree and shrub removal (10' from the edge of the road, minimum)
- tree-trimming (16' vertical and 16' horizontal from the centerline of the road. All trimming to follow ANSI A-300 Pruning standards)
- pavement markings
- sweeping
- minor bridge repair and culvert repair shall be the responsibility of the jurisdiction assigned that section of road

Each party shall control their maintenance operations as required by their respective policies and employees are to be covered by their own employer's insurance. It is the intent of this agreement that both parties shall act responsibly and promptly, taking into account its own rules and tempering its response according to type and severity of the maintenance issues that arise.

Normal and routine maintenance does not include the following work items:

- paving
- sign repair or replacement
- seal coating
- rock surfacing
- frost boil repair
- shoulder rock
- full depth patching and grading
- bridge and culvert rehabilitation or replacement – does not include cleaning out of culverts
- does not include private driveway culvert repair, replacement, or cleaning
- weed control or eradication – all county roadside areas are included in Linn County's integrated roadside vegetation management plan

These work items are to be negotiated separately between either jurisdictions department heads or designees. If the proposed work exceeds \$5,000 a maintenance project agreement shall be completed and shall be approved by the respective Councils/Boards prior to completion of the work.

Rock surfaced roads shall have 1,000 tons/mile of class A crushed stone surfacing meeting Iowa DOT specifications applied with this agreement and at 5 year intervals during the life of this agreement on all shared/100% owned roads. This may be owner jurisdiction or by paying actual cost to jurisdiction in charge.

Dust Control shall be permitted by the jurisdiction that has maintenance jurisdiction control. Residents who wish to obtain dust control must obtain a permit from the entity with maintenance jurisdiction control

Work within right-of-way permits must be applied for through the jurisdiction that has maintenance control and must follow said jurisdictions policies and standards. Entrance permits must be obtained through the jurisdiction where the property is located. Notification of approved entrance permits along shared roads must be forwarded to the jurisdiction that has maintenance control.

CONSTRUCTION

- Both jurisdictions shall approve plans and specifications before contracts are let or construction begins.
- The cost of all new construction, regardless of type, shall be borne based on jurisdictional limits.
- The planning and project administration of this construction shall be the responsibility of the jurisdiction that has the maintenance responsibility for the segment.
- A 7.5% project administration fee shall be included with the project invoice. The 7.5% fee applies to project costs within said jurisdiction.
- Each jurisdiction is to acquire rights-of-way within its own respective boundaries, as required.

The County and City as deemed necessary shall provide snow and ice control on the other's portion of the routes as listed and as shown on the attached. Each party shall control their operations as directed by their individual winter maintenance policies. It is the intent of this agreement that both parties shall act responsibly and promptly, taking into account their policy and the type, severity, and duration of the storm.

Requests for additional snow and ice control on roads within the incorporated area may be considered by the County, and the County shall be reimbursed from the City for the reasonable cost of this service. The requested additional work may be performed after the County has completed its regularly scheduled work outside of the incorporated area. The routes listed in this agreement may be reviewed periodically by the County and City.

Requests for additional snow and ice control on roads within the unincorporated area may be considered by the City, and the City shall be reimbursed from the County for the reasonable cost of this service. The requested additional work may be performed after the City has completed its regularly scheduled work inside the incorporated area. The routes listed in this agreement may be reviewed periodically by the County and City.

The City and County agree to save and indemnify and keep harmless, each other against all liabilities, judgments, costs, and expenses which may in any way come against the County or City or which in any way result from carelessness or neglect of either party or its agents, employees, or workmen in any respect whatsoever.

The City and County agree to indemnify and hold each other, their employees and agents, wholly harmless from any damages, claims, demands, or suits by any person or persons arising out of any acts or omissions by the City or County, its agents, servants or employees in the course of any work done in connection with any of the matters set forth in this agreement.

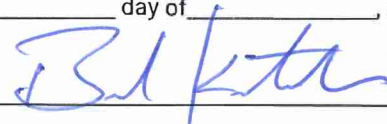

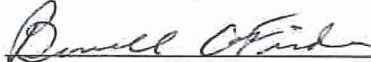

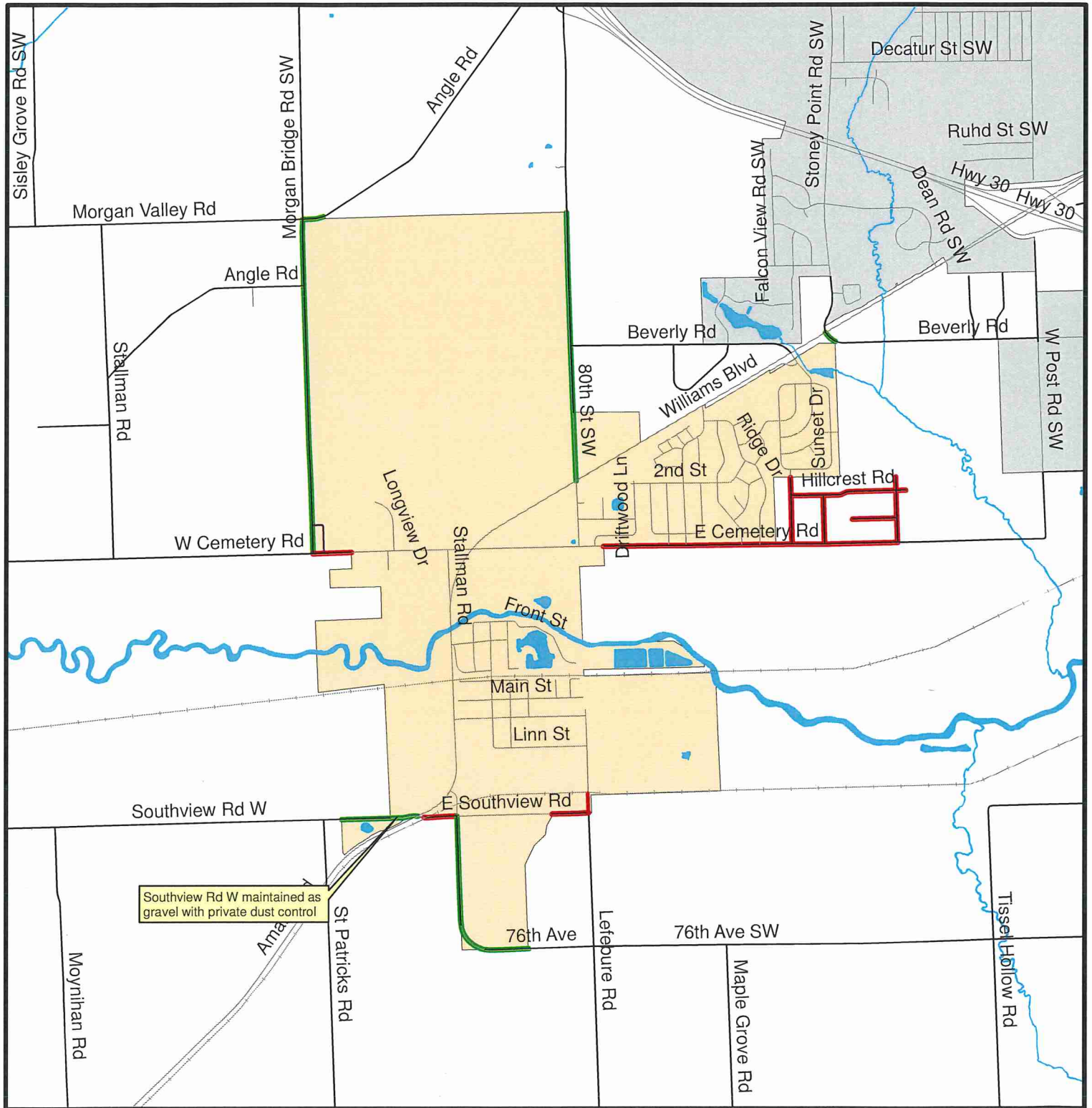

Work within right-of-way permits must be applied for through the jurisdiction that has maintenance control and must follow said jurisdictions policies and standards. Entrance permits must be obtained through the jurisdiction where the property is located. Notification of approved entrance permits along shared roads must be forwarded to the jurisdiction that has maintenance control.

CONSTRUCTION

- Both jurisdictions shall approve plans and specifications before contracts are let or construction begins.
- The cost of all new construction, regardless of type, shall be borne based on jurisdictional limits.
- The planning and project administration of this construction shall be the responsibility of the jurisdiction that has the maintenance responsibility for the segment.
- A 7.5% project administration fee shall be included with the project invoice. The 7.5% fee applies to project costs within said jurisdiction.
- Each jurisdiction is to acquire rights-of-way within its own respective boundaries, as required.

The County and City as deemed necessary shall provide snow and ice control on the other's portion of the routes as listed and as shown on the attached. Each party shall control their operations as directed by their individual winter maintenance policies. It is the intent of this agreement that both parties shall act responsibly and promptly, taking into account their policy and the type, severity, and duration of the storm.

Requests for additional snow and ice control on roads within the incorporated area may be considered by the County, and the County shall be reimbursed from the City for the reasonable cost of this service. The requested additional work may be performed after the County has completed its regularly scheduled work outside of the incorporated area. The routes listed in this agreement may be reviewed periodically by the County and City.

Requests for additional snow and ice control on roads within the unincorporated area may be considered by the City, and the City shall be reimbursed from the County for the reasonable cost of this service. The requested additional work may be performed after the City has completed its regularly scheduled work inside the incorporated area. The routes listed in this agreement may be reviewed periodically by the County and City.

The City and County agree to save and indemnify and keep harmless, each other against all liabilities, judgments, costs, and expenses which may in any way come against the County or City or which in any way result from carelessness or neglect of either party or its agents, employees, or workmen in any respect whatsoever.

The City and County agree to indemnify and hold each other, their employees and agents, wholly harmless from any damages, claims, demands, or suits by any person or persons arising out of any acts or omissions by the City or County, its agents, servants or employees in the course of any work done in connection with any of the matters set forth in this agreement.

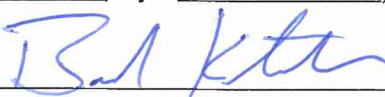
This agreement shall supersede any previous shared road maintenance and snow & ice control agreements and be in effect from the date of approval by the City Council and the Linn County Board of Supervisors and shall remain in effect until 30 days following either party providing a written notice for termination.

This agreement as hereby entered into by both parties is executed in three copies, either of which constitutes the original.

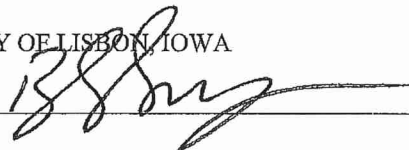

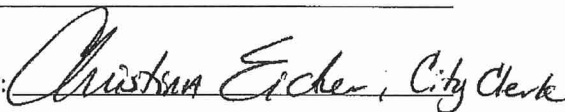

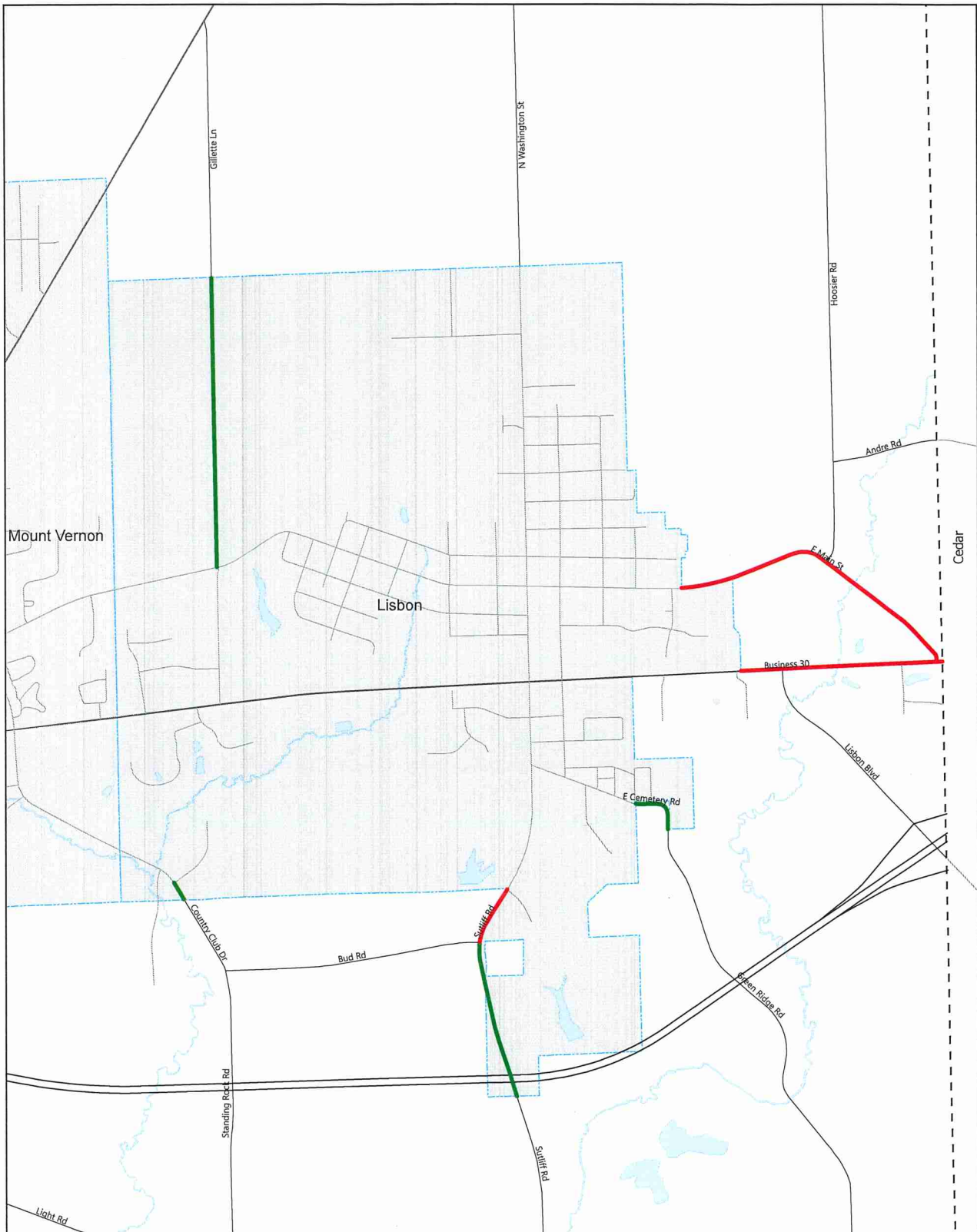

WHEREAS, Ron Ziegler has been an active and civically contributing member of the greater Cedar Rapids Area since he arrived in 1988 as an actuary with Life Investors; and

WHEREAS, Hope Community Development Association (Hope CDA) was separately formed from that effort to provide a residential constructions job training program for those with employment barriers who would be constructing and rehabilitating these post-flood houses; and

WHEREAS, Ron Ziegler was instrumental in building up Hope CDA's jobs training program as the Executive Director and Board Member, by providing training and work experience in the construction, landscaping, and woodworking fields for men

with employment barriers who have a desire be successful in the workplace, in their neighborhoods, and with their families; and

WHEREAS, Hope CDA's life transformation program accepts ten men each year and provides them housing, counsels and educates them, provides them with full-time employment with construction, landscaping, and woodcraft jobs, and implements accountability programs for daily life use in overcoming addiction; and

WHEREAS, Hope CDA has had over 50 men complete this program and enter the workforce and civic life better prepared to deal with life's challenges and positively contribute to the community; and

WHEREAS, Ron Ziegler continues to build and strengthen Hope CDA as an organization that makes a profound difference in the community and in the individual lives of men seeking a second chance;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors, Linn County, Iowa, this date met in lawful session, that the Linn County Board of Supervisors honors Ron Ziegler for his work with Hope CDA in rehabilitating neighborhoods and in rehabilitating men through this important charitable work.
